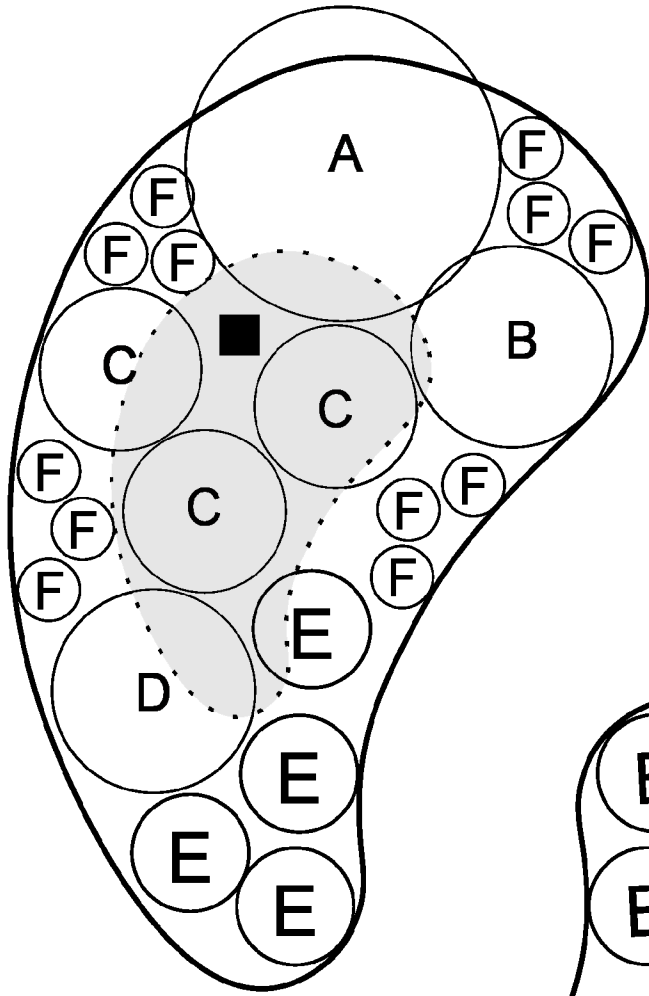

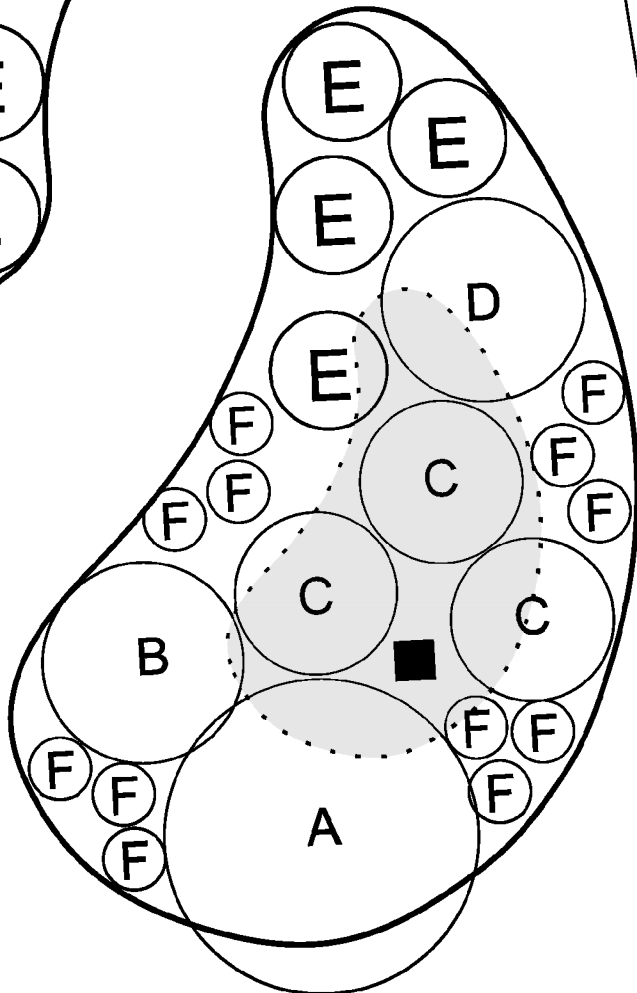
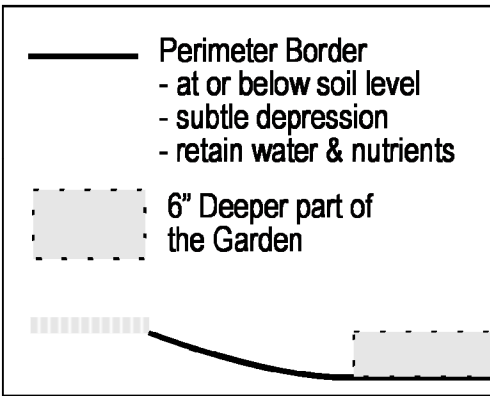

Key	Common Name	Botanical Name	Quantity	Manage Size To	Spacing Allotment	Notes:	Care:
A	Culver's root	Veronicastrum virginicum	1	4x7	4'	Long blooming veronica-like tiers of flowers offers butterflies footing.	Trim new growth 1/3 once mid- sprint to encourage tight upright growth Shape and prune again after bloom to keep its manicured tidy appearance
A	Swamp hibiscus	Hibiscus lasiocarpus	1	4x7	4'	Showy large flower attractive to pollinators.	Leave stalks intact over winter to mark location. Growth is late starting in the spring.
A	Hoptree	Ptelea trifoliata	1	10x15'	4'	Maintain to site accommodations. Butterfly host plant-caterpillars	growth rate slows with maturity-easy to maintain size
B	White wild indigo	Baptisia alba macrophylla	1	3x4'	3'	A stunning cut flower	Trim back gently after bloom to keep form and shape
B	purple cone flower	Echinacea purpurea	1	2-1/2-3'	3'	Gold finch favorite	deadhead to extend flower period-leave last flowers for finch
B	Prairie dock	Silphium terebinthinaceum	1	2x3	3'	Foliage height - bloom ht is tall & airy-may not bloom if in too windy spot. Butterfly & goldfinch fav!	remove flower stalks after bloom
C	Shinning bluestar	Amsonia illustris	3	2-1/2x3-1/2	2'	Lovely early blooming as well as late good foliage	trim back to foliage after bloom
C	Showy goldenrod	Solidago rigida	3	2-1/2x3-1/2	2'	Larger and more upright flowers - butterfly magnet	shovel edge around base spring and after bloom
D	Swamp milkweed	Asclepia incarnata	1	4-5'	2-1/2'	Watch for caterpillars	Moderate spread rate -easy to control. Dead head after bloom to control reseeding
D	Blue sage	Salvia azurea var. grandiflora	1	3-1/2x4-1/2	2-1/2'	Very pretty blue flowers	trim tips back 1/3 to 1/2 in spring to encourage tight habit and branching. May delay bloom period
D	Smooth Blue aster	Aster laevis	1	2-1/2-3-1/2	2-1/2'	Upright and large showy flowers	Control reseeding by removing flowers as they finish blooming
E	Wild Bergemont	Monarda fistulosa	4	2-1/2-3-1/2	spacing 1-1/2'	Great for both butterfly and hummingbird	cut back hard after bloom / shovel edge around perimeter to maintain tight clump
E	Foxglove beard tongue	Talus slope penstemon	4	2-1/2-3-1/2	spacing 1-1/2'	Great for hummingbird. Recent name change from Penstemon digitalis	remove finished flowering stalks to encourage second surge of foliage
E	Prairie dropseed	Sporobolus heterolepsis	4	2-1/2-3-1/2	spacing 1-1/2'	Only fragrant grass - smells like buttered popcorn!	wait to cut back in spring till new growth evident at base
F	Golden alexander	Zizia aurea	12	14-36"	spacing 9"	Host plant for black swallowtail	prune back flower stalks as they finish
F	Virginia iris	Iris virginica	12	14-36"	spacing 9"	Maintains good foliage through season	remove flower stalks after bloom
F	Spiderwort	Tradescantia virginiana	12	14-36"	spacing 9"	Long blooming upright orchid-like flowers that open and close	remove flower stalks and trim foliage back after flowering
